HARMONY DAY

Since 1999, more than 77,000 Harmony Week events have been held in childcare centres, schools, community groups, churches, businesses and federal, state and local government agencies across Australia. Harmony Day is a time to celebrate Australian multiculturalism and is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values. Australia is one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world and we should celebrate this and work to maintain it.

NAPLAN 2021

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. These tests are administered in May each year.

The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process - it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. This year NPS students in Years 3 and 5 will be completing NAPLAN via the pencil and paper process. More information on NAPLAN will be sent home to parents at the beginning of Term 2.

PARENT and TEACHER MEETINGS

Parent and teacher meetings this year will be on Monday 22 March and Tuesday 23 March. The interviews will be held from 2:45pm until 7:00pm on the Monday evening and between 2:45pm and 4:00pm on the Tuesday afternoon. This year bookings will be online. Notes have already been sent home giving the specific details of how to make a booking. Make sure you make a booking before 4pm today.

SCHOOL OPAL CARDS

We have been asked by Busways to ask those families who are interested in using the school bus service to apply for opal cards. This is an important process because the Opal data collected determines the level of service provided, therefore, these applications will assist our cause in securing a bus service for Northbourne PS children. School Zone Offences

It's always disappointing to receive feedback from parents and community members about dangerous and disrespectful road safety behaviour in and around the school. Recently, we had a visit from the Road Safety Officer from Blacktown City Council who has sent this information through to me to share with the Northbourne community.

Dear Ms Hedge

I visited your school yesterday afternoon following concerns about road safety issues around the school. I'd like to make the following observations to share with your parents:

- Thank you to the parents and students who used one of the pedestrian crossings to cross the road. Well done. Unfortunately some children and some parents decided not to cross safely at a pedestrian crossing even though there was one nearby. This is dangerous and foolish behaviour for children to witness as they are likely to copy what the adults do.
- 2. There are two more pedestrian crossings to be installed by the Department of Education around the school in the coming months. One of these will be on Bolwarra Drive and the other on Northbourne Avenue. Until these crossings are installed please take care getting children across these roads.
- 3. There is a Bus Zone on Bolwarra Drive outside the school gate. Many vehicles were parked in the area yesterday afternoon during the pick up time. The fine for parking in this area is at least \$344 and also has 2 demerit points as this is a school zone.
- 4. There are No Parking zones on Beale Street. This is the Kiss and Drop area for the school at the moment. This means that during the times shown on the sign, vehicles cannot be there for more than 2 minutes and drivers must remain within 3 metres of their vehicle. The fine for disobeying a NO Parking sign is at least \$191 and also has 2 demerit points as this is a school zone.


6. Lots of parents parked and walk in to collect their children. Parking away from the school helps to relieve congestion at the gate. Just make sure that you do not park over or blocking a driveway. It is also illegal to park within 10m of an intersection. Both of these are offences that can also get a driver a fine.

I look forward to working with the school community to help keep our children safe.
