A t Northbourne Public School we respect the identity, culture, heritage and languages of Aboriginal students and endeavour to be a welcoming and respectful place for all.


During our teaching and learning activities across all classrooms K-6, all students develop an understanding of the true history of the lands on which we live.

Road Safety - Keeping Our Students Safe

Many parents have expressed their concerns about the safety of the children at NPS when they are arriving and departing each day. The concerns arise from parents ignoring the road rules in their determination to collect their children with no thought for the safety of others around them. It is the collective responsibility of this school community to keep our children safe by driving cautiously and following basic road rules. The following is a list of those rules:

- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvers such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in our school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car

Lost Property



We congratulate all of our 2021 leaders and wish them a successful and productive 2021.





National Sorry Day

National Sorry Day, or the National Day of Healing, is an annual event that has been held since 1998. Classes across Northbourne Public School were involved in activities to acknowledge the day. Here is a recount of the activities that S2M undertook to mark the occasion.

In week 6, S2M acknowledged Reconciliation Week and National Sorry Day. Throughout the week we embedded Reconciliation week activities into our literacy groups. As a whole class we performed 'Welcome to all People' by Ruby Hunter at our assembly. Mr Marchetta and Mr Petrovic also played

along with their guitars. Nimit and Sara acknowledged these significant events by researching these events and read the following in the assembly:

Reconciliation Week is held every year from 27 May until the 3 June and is a chance for all Australians to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture. The 2021 theme is 'More Than a Word Reconciliation Takes Action'.

National Sorry Day is observed annually on 26 May and remembers and acknowledges the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who were forcibly removed from their families and communities, which we now know as 'The Stolen Generation.'

Together as a class we have been learning about the Stolen Generation, former Prime Minister Kevin Rudd's National Sorry Day Speech to parliament, the 2021 Schools Reconciliation Challenge theme – 'Under One Sky – Yesterday, Today and Forever' and the Darug people who are the traditional custodians of the land of Elara.



Featherdale Wildlife Park

This week Stage 1 visited Featherdale Wildlife Park to make the learning they have had in class come to life. It was a wonderful day for our students and teachers who saw many Australian wildlife such as kangaroos, koalas, snakes, wombats and birds, including penguins.

Bikes and Scooters

There are now two bike racks for students now that we have moved into the new space. Students can ride their bikes or scooter to and from school it is important that they do so in a safe manner. We are very excited to be in our new library space! Thank you very much to everyone that donated books to our new library, these books have all been processed and are slowly making their way to the shelves. During class time students have been exploring the library and enthusiastically engaging in texts within our library space. The library is also being used for students to read stories, complete puzzles, draw and play board games during lunchtime.

Premiers Reading Challenge is well underway with all K-2 classes having completed the challenge and 20 3-6students having completed the task individually. The competition runs until mid August so there is still plenty of time for 3-6 students to finish the challenge. To complete this challenge, students are required to read 20 books with 15 of those being from the PRC list. Students have been shown how to log their books online through the PRC website.

Students have been using our new online borrowing system called Sora to borrow books electronically while our library has been getting set up. Students will have access to this fabulous resource all year. To access Sora, students require their school email address and passwords which are available from their classroom teacher.


